Learning Overview

Literacy

Writing

This term, we are focusing on personal writing, giving pupils the opportunity to write about their own experiences in an informative and engaging way. We will also introduce report writing linked to our social studies topic, using it as a stimulus to record and present information in a variety of formats.

Reading

Our focus in reading will be on understanding and analysing texts, with a particular emphasis on identifying bias in non-fiction. Pupils will read a range of texts, looking for examples of fact and opinion, exploring writing techniques used to influence readers, and making decisions about the usefulness and reliability of different sources.

Listening and Talking

In Listening and Talking, we are developing skills in questioning techniques. P6/5 will learn how to ask and identify literal, inferential, and evaluative questions, as well as how to frame thoughtful and purposeful questions during discussions.

How can I support my learner at home?

- Continue to encourage personal reading at home
- Journalling/keeping a diary
- Board games scrabble, articulate
- · Reading non-fiction together

Numeracy

This term, pupils will develop their money management skills by learning how to compare costs from different retailers and determine what is affordable using the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division). They will also explore the costs, benefits, and risks of using bank cards to buy goods or withdraw cash and understand the importance of budgeting in everyday life. We will also build on our number knowledge by learning about the order of operations and practising how to solve expressions and equations.

Maths

In Maths, we are continuing our work with 2D shapes and 3D objects, focusing on using mathematical language to describe their properties accurately. Pupils will also learn to recognise and draw 3D nets.

Additionally, we will explore data handling, learning different ways to organise and present information clearly and effectively.
